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## BY THE BOTTLE

### WHITE WINES;

1. **Valdecaz Verdejo,** Toro Spain **£17.95**  
Citrus and lime notes, dry with a refreshing touch.

**Producer profile;** Monte La Reina are a modern family winery based in the Toro region of Spain, focusing on Verdejo for their whites and Tinta de Toro (Tempranillo) for their reds.

2. **Cielo Trebbiano Pinot Grigio,** Venezie Italy **£19.50**  
Clean and crisp notes, fresh apple and peaches with a soft fruity finish.

**Producer profile;** Established in 1908 Cielo is now run by the fourth generation family members. Over the years they have built a solid reputation on quality and grown from just small vineyard holding to a family winery with international demand.

3. **Somborne Valley White,** Hampshire, England **£19.95**  
Fresh herbaceous white with hints of pears and apples.

**Producer profile;** We are rather proud to say this is ours, the Somborne Valley Vineyards are on our Hoplands Estate, sitting on the chalk slopes above King's Somborne. We have two vineyards, one planted in 2000 and the other in 2006 producing a mixture of red and white varieties.

4. **Ugarte Viura,** Rioja Spain **£24.95**  
An exciting nose of ripe fruits, clean and light in style.

**Producer profile;** In 1870 Eguren Ugarte family inherited a small parcel of vines in gratitude for looking after the healer Pascio Pangua in his later years. The estate now stands at over 130 hectares of vines and in the late 1980's they built a gravitational fed state of the art winery.

5. **Castelnau Picpoul de Pinet,** Picpoul de Pinet France **£25.50**  
Zesty, fragrant Picpoul full of refreshing citrus character.

**Producer profile;** Owned by the Lord of Guers as from the 13th century, the Domaine de Castelnau has very ancient origins. Since 1997, the estate belongs to Béatrice and Christophe Muret, who are passionate about wine and their vineyards.

6. **Stoneburn Sauvignon Blanc,** Marlborough New Zealand **£26.50**  
Enticing Marlborough Sauvignon, zesty and tangy with a crisp finish.

**Producer profile;** Jane Hunter has been one of the most influential people in the New Zealand Wine industry. Established in 1978, they were amongst the first and now have worldwide recognition for the quality of their wines.

7. **Laxas Valdocea Albarinho** Rias Baixas, Spain **£32.95**  
Hints of melon and mango, aromatic in style with a touch of freshness.

**Producer profile;** There have been vineyards at the property since 1862. The estate is now run by the Simon Ferro and family who have focused on modernising techniques and producing world class wines.

8. **Hunters Riesling,** Marlborough New Zealand **£34.95**  
Zesty lime notes, off dry with an enticing citrus finish.

**Producer profile;** Jane Hunter has been one of the most influential people in the New Zealand Wine industry. Established in 1978, they were amongst the first and now have worldwide recognition for the quality of their wines.

9. **Domaine Hamelin Chablis** Burgundy France **£39.95**  
Dry and elegant Sauvignon with refreshing notes and an enticing finish.

**Producer profile;** With wine roots tracing back to 1840, the Hamelin family have a long tradition of making fine wines. The knowledge handed down from generation to generation is a harmonious mix of old traditions and modern-day techniques.

## RED WINES;

- 10. Valdecáz Tempranillo,** Toro Spain **£17.95**  
Morello cherries and plum fruits, soft and supple tannins with a touch of spice.  
**Producer profile;** Monte La Reina are a modern family winery based in the Toro region of Spain, focusing on Verdejo for their whites and Tinta de Toro (Tempranillo) for their reds.
- 11. Domaine Bosquet Merlot Cabernet,** Côtes de Thongue France **£19.95**  
Vibrant ripe blackberries and dark fruits, followed by a smooth soft finish.  
**Producer profile;** With a respectable 120 hectares of vineyards located next to his ancestral family home, Philippe de Berthier can trace his family history back to 1495 in the local vineyards. Domaine Bosquet enjoys a lovely location on the gentle hills overlooking the Mediterranean Sea.
- 12. Somborne Valley Red,** Hampshire, England **£19.95**  
Rich red, full of berry fruits from the owners of Tregarthen's.  
**Producer profile;** We are rather proud to say this is ours, the Somborne Valley Vineyards are on our Hoplands Estate, sitting on the chalk slopes above King's Somborne. We have two vineyards, one planted in 2000 and the other in 2006 producing a mixture of red and white varieties.
- 13. Domaine de Castelnau Pinot Noir,** Pays D'Oc France **£23.95**  
Delicate red berry fruits, light in style with gentle tannins.  
**Producer profile;** Owned by the Lord of Guers as from the 13th century, the Domaine de Castelnau has very ancient origins. Since 1997, the estate belongs to Béatrice and Christophe Muret, who are passionate about wine and their vineyards.
- 14. Chamiza Malbec,** Mendoza Argentina **£26.95**  
A deep ruby wine with ripe juicy plum and damson notes, followed by a hint of spice.  
**Producer profile;** The Chamiza estate was founded in 1918 and winemaking project starting in 2003. The objective of the Alsina family is achieving excellence in high-end wines, elegance and the essence of Argentina.
- 15. Ugarte Cosecha,** Rioja Spain **£27.95**  
Aromas of spice and berries, give way to delicious flavours of blackberry and blueberry.  
**Producer profile;** In 1870 Eguren Ugarte family inherited a small parcel of vines in gratitude for looking after the healer Pascio Pangua in his later years. The estate now stands at over 130 hectares of vines and in the late 1980's they built a gravitational fed state of the art winery.
- 16. Johnny Q Shiraz Viognier,** South Australia **£28.95**  
Dark berry aromas, this wine is beautifully balanced with ripe berry fruits.  
**Producer profile;** John and Josephine Quarisa live by the belief "passion is everything". Their passion extends far beyond the family, their hobbies and through their wines. John has worked as winemaker throughout Australia before setting up Quarisa Wines.
- 17. Crusher Cabernet Sauvignon,** California, USA **£34.95**  
Full bodied with warm dark fruits and spicy tannins.  
**Producer profile;** More than 110 years ago, the Sebastiani family embarked on a winemaking journey, settling down roots in Sonoma, California. With passion, hard work and decades of pioneering the Californian wine industry, the Crusher wines were born.
- 18. Château Fonbel, St. Emilion Grand Cru,** St Emilion Bordeaux France **£49.95**  
Rich and full with warm dark fruits and spicy tannins, stunning.  
**Producer profile;** Château de Fonbel covers 16 hectares of vineyards in the St Emilion wine appellation. This property lies below Ausone and Moulin St Georges and belongs to the same owner, Alain Vauthier. Despite very reasonable pricing, it benefits hugely from the attentions of Mr Vauthier, regarded by some as the finest winemaker in St Emilion.

## ROSÉ WINES

**19. Cielo Pinot Grigio Rosé,** Venetie Italy **£19.95**  
Light pale salmon colour, refreshingly dry with summer berry fruits.

**Producer profile;** Established in 1908 Cielo is now run by the fourth generation family members. Over the years they have built a solid reputation on quality and grown from just small vineyard holding to a family winery with international demand.

**20. Snapper Rock Sauvignon Rosé,** Marlborough New Zealand **£25.95**  
Red berry notes and wild herbs on the nose, delicate in style with a hint of minerality.

**Producer profile;** Created by winemaker David Clouston Snapper Rock wines are focused on delivering the fruit driven styles of wine that has made Marlborough famous, while the cool climate of the most southern valley of the Marlborough region adds something special not found anywhere else in Marlborough.

## SPARKLING WINES

**21. Arcabello Prosecco N.V.** Prosecco, Italy **£25.95**  
Refreshingly dry with crisp citrus notes.

**Producer profile;** Stefano Girelli (Italian), Philippe Marx (French) and Peter Kosten (Dutch) got together in 2009 to create a new kind of wine company. Having worked together for many years at leading Italian producer Casa Girelli.

**22. Somborne Valley Brut,** Hampshire, England **£49.95**  
A stunning alternative to Champagne and produced by Tregarthen's owners.

**Producer profile;** We are rather proud to say this is ours, the Somborne Valley Vineyards are on our Hoplands Estate, sitting on the chalk slopes above King's Somborne. We have two vineyards, one planted in 2000 and the other in 2006 producing a mixture of red and white varieties.

**23. Polgoon Pinot Noir Rosé,** Cornwall, England **£47.95**  
Enticing summer fruits, dry with a delicate mousse.

**Producer profile;** After many years trading as fish merchants John and Kim Coulson decided they needed a new adventure. After meeting an award-winning Cornish winemaker they decided to plant vines and create their own Cornish vineyard. From their first wine harvest in 2006, they created the first Polgoon wine.

**24. Bollinger N.V.,** Champagne France **£79.95**  
Bubble like velvet, beautifully aromatic. A classic

**Producer profile;** The story began with Athanase de Villermont, the youngest son of a noble family. A great soldier who shone during the American War of Independence, he inherited an extensive estate from his family in the Aÿ area. He foresaw the extraordinary potential of the wines of Champagne, but as an aristocrat he was forbidden to become involved in trade. He then met Joseph Bollinger, a widely travelled German who had left his country of birth to learn about the Champagne wine trade, and Paul Renaudin, a local man who was fascinated by the world of wine. The firm of Renaudin-Bollinger & Cie was founded on 6th February 1829

## DESSERT WINES

**25. Château Petit Vedrines,** Sauternes France **37.5cl £29.95**  
Sweet citrus aromas with hint of orange marmalade and honey

**Producer Profile;** Château Petit Vedrines is the second wine of Château Doisy-Vedrines a 2eme Cru Classe property and has been owned by the Casteja family since 1946.

**26. Malamado Malbec,** Mendoza Argentina **£45.00**  
Full bodied dark fruit notes, a hint of sweetness with gentle tannins, delicious.

**Producer Profile;** Familia Zuccardi is a family company founded in 1963 by Engineer Alberto Zuccardi. In those times, he began planting vines in Maipú (province of Mendoza), experimenting with an irrigation system of his own creation based on a method used in California.
